Sermon - Jerimiah 29:11



'Grow Where You're Planted'

Jerimiah writes to the exiled believers in Babylon promising hope and a future (29:11) while being brutally honest about their long term situation (vs. 10). Admiral James Stockdale was a Vietnam POW at the so-called Hanoi Hilton tortured over 20 times during his eight-year imprisonment. Jim Collins the writer of the book "Good to Great" coined the term the Stockdale paradox – you must retain faith that you will prevail in the end and you must also confront the brutal facts of your current reality. In other words, "Grow where you are planted."
