Speaking of March, listed below is both our *Lenten Bible Study* outline and Sunday sermon scriptures for the month (*with no marching required*).

Our Lenten Bible Study focuses on Psalms, the hymnbook of the Bible, dividing the book into five sections (we covered the first section in February).



Wed. March 3rd - we'll examine and discuss the second section - Psalms 42-72

Wed. March 10th - the third section - Psalms 73-89

Wed. March 17th - the fourth section – Psalms 90-106

Wed. March 24 - the fifth section - Psalms 107-150

Our Sunday sermon scriptures for the month are from your favorite scriptures I've collected so far. Several of you have chosen the same passage. We explored the 23^{rd} Psalm and Joshua 1:9 in February, the first two weeks of Lent.

The third week of Lent - Sunday March 7th Jeremiah 29:11 - I have plans to prosper you, says the Lord (celebrating communion).

The fourth week of Lent - Sunday March 14th Isaiah 41:10 – Do not fear I will strengthen you, says the Lord.

The fifth week of Lent - Sunday March 21st 1 Corinthians 13 - The great Love passage.

The sixth week of Lent - Sunday March 28th Palm Sunday Luke 19:28-44 (one of the traditional scriptures depicting Jesus triumphal *march i*nto Jerusalem).

Remember that you can join us in person on Wednesdays and Sundays with Covid guidelines in place or watch online anytime.

Note: The January 31st offering did not record until February 1st in the amount of \$4,770.00 which is not included in the above figures.

I have filed the forgiveness application for the Payroll Protection Loan that we received last May. Those funds will be moved from the loan payable to the current expense in February. I have also filed and been approved for the second round of Payroll Protection Loans that have been offered. They will be treated in the same manner as the first.

Our first quarter Special Offering is for the Youngstown Community Food Center. Located near downtown Youngstown feeding families each Tuesday morning 52 weeks a year. They have been in existence since 1986 supplying food and non-food items to the less fortunate. They are currently providing for over 7,590 families a month. This inter-agency food bank works in the Mahoning and Trumbull and surrounding counties to reduce hunger acting as a non-profit clearing house which helps prevent the waste of edible foods.

We have received a thank you from the third quarter Special Offering recipient, *Christina House*. Thank you to all for your continued support of Mt. Olivet's mission to serve God, serve others.

We welcome everyone to come join at any time!




MOVERS & SEEKERS

The class enjoys some much-needed fellowship as well as learning and growing in our relationship with God. It's not too late to join us..... check it out!




YOUTH SUNDAY SCHOOL
