Spring is finally here and it's a wonderful time to welcome back God's magnificent creations like birds, butterflies and beautiful flowers! Sunny, warmer weather also brings back the joys of long walks and working in the yard. Staying active is great and being outside gives us the opportunity to slow down and open all of our senses to what is going on around us. There is life everywhere!



Hummingbirds are already down south and working their way up to see us! Males tend to be about two weeks ahead of the females. In our region, hummingbirds can be expected to arrive mid-to-late April and into May. Feeders are recommended to be placed out at one to two weeks ahead so that early arrivals have access to nutrition, making for a successful migration, especially since there is not a lot of flowers available yet. **To make a healthy, homemade nectar recipe for our friends try this: mix one part plain**

granulated, white table sugar to four parts water in a small saucepan. Heat slowly for a couple minutes, this allows the sugar to dissolve and to reach a slow fermentation. Allow the mixture to completely cool before putting into a feeder.



There are around 140 butterfly species that make their home in Ohio. In the early spring, over-wintering butterflies and caterpillars are still in diapause (hibernation). Don't be in a hurry to mow or cleanup your yard too soon, it will destroy the habitat the insect has used as shelter over the winter. Use care when trimming bushes and trees, because some species hang out through the winter in a cocoon or chrysalis from branches and twigs. When the

time is right, they will emerge to collect nectar and pollinate. Plant milkweed if you want some Monarch butterfly visitors! Native plants provide the most benefit to the butterflies and other pollinators.



Spring wildflowers are one of the highlights of the season as their colors emerge from the decaying forest floors. This is a great time of year to take a trip to one of Ohio's parks and enjoy the scenery. Ohio has 74 state parks, 21 state forests, 136 nature preserves, and 117 wildlife areas, including one national park – Cuyahoga Valley. There is over 600,000 acres to explore. These parks include trails that are easy, some including paved access, to

more difficult adventures. There is also a vast amount of county, city, and Metroparks to utilize. Take your family or friends on a picnic and take a walk to see how many birds, other critters and flowers that you can find. For more information on Ohio's state parks, please visit Ohio Department of Natural Resource's website. You can also use the AllTrails app or webpage to get details on specific trails.
