If we take ourselves too seriously, we tend to lose perspective. We may turn on ourselves in anger and become rigid and tense – both physically and psychologically.

Laughter, itself, has a healing effect. Laughter stimulates the brain to secrete endorphins and enkephalins, powerful chemical pain relievers; adrenaline and similar hormones are released which stimulate the heart and lungs.

Heart rate increases, blood is more thoroughly oxygenated, and the immune system produces more lymphocytes. During laughter the muscles of the face, thorax, an abdomen contract and relax, prompting Norman Cousins to call it 'Internal Jogging.' It also massages the internal organs. When you stop laughing, arteries and muscles relax, and blood pressure is reduced.


