I'd like to share excerpts from two books I've been reading (and rereading) that speaks to Holy Wholeness and the full power of the Gospel.

First, from "The Wholeness Handbook: Care of Body, Mind, Spirit for Optimal Health" written by Elain V. Emeth & Janet H. Greenhut, M.D. (1991).

"We are able to respond creatively to any distress in our lives, whether it is a physical distress, emotional problem, relationship problems, or whatever form of distress may take. A creative response, one that is life enhancing for one's self or for others, will lead to greater wholeness, regardless of whether or not the disease is cured." Health, then, is a by-product of becoming aware of and living out our truth about who we have been created to be. We can develop a lovingly self-disciplined and highly pleasurable way of life for ourselves that enhances discovery of the true self. This positive <u>Self-care</u> will minimize the risk of preventable diseases and maximize the potential for healthy, whole, and holy living, even through experiences of illness and other life experiences. The central requirement is that we learn to care lovingly for our whole Selves" (page 26).

Do you love (care for) yourself as much you would want to be loved (cared for) by others?

Second, from "*The Journey toward Wholeness*" written by Kenneth L. Bakken & Kathleen H. Hofeller (1988).

"We cannot separate the spiritual from the physical, and our relationship with God has a profound effect on our health and well-being. When we are in open and honest dialogue with God, we experience unconditional love and forgiveness. We can be healed of our neurotic guilt, anxiety, and depression and subsequently of the deleterious effects of those feelings on our bodies. The prevailing world view, however, does not acknowledge the reality of a nonphysical spiritual realm...Unfortunately, the church has tended to reduce Jesus' life, death, and resurrection to rationalistic terms that have no context for healings, visions, and miracles. We have been left with moral teachings but with no power by which to live. Jesus reminds us that we must become like little children in order to enter the kingdom of God. Young children live happily with one foot in the physical world and one in the spiritual realm. A "remythologized" Christianity helps us to reclaim the power of Gospel – life renewed, made full and whole with hope, peace, and love" (page 54-55).

Are we experiencing the <u>whole</u> power of the Gospel?

## Niki's Favorites

Heavenly recipes tested by Mt. Olivet's official FOODIE

Prep: 10 mins. Total: 2hrs 18 mins

Cook: 8 mins. Servings: 2 Additional: 2 hrs.

This is one of our new favorites! I recommend a nice, long marinade time - at least 8 and up to 24 hours. I also like a little bit of char from the grill flames. Enjoy!

#### **Ingredients:**

1 (1lb.) beef skirt steak

1/3 cup hoisin sauce

3 tablespoons Chinese vinegar (or sherry vinegar)

1 tablespoon soy sauce

2 teaspoons hot sauce

2 teaspoons sesame oil

1 tablespoon grated fresh ginger root

4 cloves of garlic, finely minced

1 tablespoon packed brown sugar

1 teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon freshly ground black pepper

1 green onion, light parts only, minced

Toasted sesame seeds



#### **Directions:**

**Step 1** - Whisk hoisin sauce, vinegar, soy sauce, hot sauce, sesame oil, grated ginger, garlic, brown sugar, salt, and paper together in a large mixing bowl.

**Step 2** - Cut skirt steak crosswise into about 4 or 5 smaller pieces. Transfer streak into marinade and toss until all pieces are evenly coated. Cover with plastic wrap. Refrigerate; marinate at least 2 hours.

**Step 3** - Line a baking pan with paper towels. Transfer pieces of steak to the paper towels and mop off some of the marinade. **Step 4** - Preheat an outdoor grill for high heat and lightly oil the grate

**Step 5** -Transfer streak pieces to grill. Cook to medium rare or medium, 4 to 5 minutes per side. An instant-read thermometer inserted in the center should read between 130-135 degrees F. Thinner pieced might finisher earlier. Transfer steak to a warm plate. Let rest for a few minutes.

**Step 6** - Transfer steak to a warm serving platter and pour any accumulated juices over skirt steak. Sprinkle with sesame seeds and sliced green onions.
